

Dogging and Rigging Policy

The companies of ARA Electrical have an obligation to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of all workers and others at their place and work. This includes ensuring safe work procedures are in place and that only people who are competent and suitably trained (and licensed where appropriate) undertake their respective work activities.

ARA Electrical has adopted the policy that no dogging or rigging operations shall be carried out by any person other than a qualified person.

ARA Electrical shall ensure that only suitably qualified and licensed persons are to undertake the crane operation and associated dogging and rigging works when;

- A person is required to hold a dogging/rigging licence where slinging techniques are used,
- Judgment in relation to the selection, suitability and condition of lifting gear is required; and
- Judgment is required on the method of slinging, taking into consideration the nature of the load, its mass and its centre of gravity; or
- The movement of a crane is being directed when the load is out of the crane operator's view.

This policy must be adhered to by all workers to ensure their safety in the workplace. Any breach in adhering to this policy may result in disciplinary action.
